Staff Recommendation:

Waive the second reading and adopt <u>Ordinance No. 2021-01</u>, Amending the Development Agreement By and Between the City of Hughson and Fitzpatrick Homes-Hughson, LLC Relating to the Development Known as Euclid North.

Background and Overview:

On January 8, 2007, the Hughson City Council adopted <u>Ordinance No. 2006-14</u> approving a Development Agreement between the City and Fitzpatrick Homes-Hughson, LLC. relating to development known as Euclid North. On November 13, 2017, for the purpose of extending the map set to expire in January 2018, the Hughson City Council adopted <u>Ordinance No. 17-08</u> approving Amendment #1 to the Development Agreement which extended the map by 48 months to January 16, 2022, raised Development Impact Fees to the rate in effect at the time of development, and added three conditions requiring formation of a Community Facilities District, as well as, provisions for installation of a water meter radio tower and Police Observation Device security camera.

Discussion:

In February 2021, Fitzpatrick Homes contacted City staff to request a second extension to the adopted Development Agreement, to account for changes in the development timeline of Euclid North. Specifically, the infrastructure for Euclid North was dependent on the development of Euclid South which bridged the distance between City water and sewer service and Euclid North. Homes within Euclid South are under construction as is the infrastructure for Euclid North.

As part of the amendment, Fitzpatrick Homes has agreed to update the City's street fee from \$1,505 to \$4,101. The fee (\$1,505) in Amendment No. 1 was not accurate and this extension presents the opportunity to correct the error. The purpose of the Development Agreement extension is to preserve the life of the approved map and associated entitlements of the project.

Following a presentation to the Planning Commission on March 23, 2021, the Commission voted unanimously to recommend that the City Council adopt Ordinance No. 2021-01.

This item is to seek City Council approval to waive the second reading, and adopt Ordinance No. 2021-01, which amends the Euclid North Development Agreement as follows:

- 1. Extends Development Agreement term for 24-months to January 16, 2024.
- 2. Changes the Street Fee from \$1,505 to \$4,101.

On April 12, 2021, a public hearing for this item was opened, and the City Council unanimously voted to waive the reading and approve an amendment to the Development Agreement by and between the City of Hughson and Fitzpatrick Homes-Hughson, LLC relating to the development known as Euclid North.

This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after its final passage.

Fiscal Impact:

The development extension and street fee increase will result in an additional \$2,596 per residence, a total of \$129,800 for the 50 residences anticipated. In addition, the Agreement allows the City the ability to adjust fees by 3% a year.

CITY OF HUGHSON CITY COUNCIL ORDINANCE NO. 2021-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUGHSON AMENDING THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF HUGHSON AND FITZPATRICK HOMES-HUGHSON, LLC RELATING TO THE DEVELOPMENT KNOWN AS EUCLID NORTH

WHEREAS, pursuant to Hughson Ordinance No. 90-59, the City of Hughson ("City") may enter into, or amend a Development Agreement with the owner and/or developer of real property within the City; and

WHEREAS, on January 8, 2007 the Hughson City Council adopted Ordinance No. 06-14 approving a Development Agreement between the City and Fitzpatrick Homes-Hughson, LLC. for the development of certain real property within the City (hereinafter called "Development Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, on November 13, 2017, the Hughson City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2017-08, approving Amendment #1 to the Development Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Fitzpatrick Homes has requested an additional extension to the term of the Development Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City and Developer are entering into this Amendment #2 to the Development Agreement to memorialize the terms affecting the remainder of the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUGHSON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Part II, Section 1.D. is hereby amended to read as follows:

"D. <u>Term</u>. The term of this Agreement shall commence upon the Effective Date and shall extend until January 16, $202\underline{4}2$ or until one (1) year after "Project Buildout" as hereinafter defined, whichever is earlier, unless said term is otherwise modified by circumstances set forth in this Agreement or by the mutual consent of the parties hereto. For purposes of this Agreement, "Project Buildout" shall mean the date on which a Certificate of Occupancy (or comparable instrument) is issued for the last project improvement or residential home or other structure to be constructed in the Project. Following the expiration of said term, this Agreement shall be deemed terminated and of no further force and effect, except as may be specified otherwise herein."

Section 2. Part II, Section 3.E. is hereby amended to read in full as follows:

"E. Fees. Fees to be paid by Developer shall be as specified in this section. Developer shall also pay fees expressly specified in this Agreement or the Project Approval, such as, but not limited to, those specified in Section 5.C.ii, or 3.F., of this Agreement. No reimbursements or credits other than those specified herein, if any, are or shall be due to Developer. Notwithstanding the preceding sentence, any fee credit resulting from additional sewer fees to fund the waste water treatment plant expansion established by the City after adoption of that certain "Advance Funding Agreement for the Hughson Waste Water Treatment Plant Agreement", entered into by and between Developer and the City, shall be applied to the Sewer Fee for the benefit of Developer if such a credit is applicable. All fees specified below shall be collected at the time of building permit issuance.

Notwithstanding the preceding portion of this Section II.3.E., the parties agree as follows:

- (i) The fees shown in the table above may be increased at three (3%) percent per year, or by the percentage increase in the Engineering News Record Construction Cost Index, at the discretion of the City Manager of City, for the period of time from recordation of this Amendment, to the time of payment of such fees; and
- (ii) Community Enhancement Fee. Developer shall pay, at the time of issuance of building permits per lot for each lot for which a building permit is issued, a community enhancement fee as identified in the table above. Such funds shall be used by City for any project which will, in City's sole discretion, enhance the quality of life for residents of the City, and/or ameliorate the negative effect on older areas of the City caused by the economic pressure generated by new

development, including but not limited to, public art, maintenance, repair or upgrading of public facilities, recreation, parks, or historical preservation. City and Developer, its successors and assigns, agree that notwithstanding any other provision of law, the imposition and accounting for these funds shall not be subject to the requirements of the Mitigation Fee Act (Government Code Sections 66000-66025)."

Section 3. All other terms and conditions of the Development Agreement, as amended, are unmodified and remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. This ordinance is not intended to and shall not be construed or given effect in a manner that imposes upon the city or any officer or employee thereof a mandatory duty of care toward persons and property within or without the city so as to provide a basis of civil liability for damages, except as otherwise imposed by law.

Section 5. If any provision of this ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable. The city council hereby declares that it would have adopted this ordinance irrespective of the validity of any particular portion thereof.

Section 6. This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after its final passage.

Section 7. Within fifteen (15) days after its final passage, the City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be posted in full accordance with Section 36933 of the Government Code.

The foregoing ordinance was introduced, and the title thereof read at the regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Hughson held on April 12, 2021, and by a unanimous vote of the council members present, further reading was waived.

THIS AMENDMENT #2 TO THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT (hereinafter this "Amendment #2") is entered into this 26 day of April, 2021, by and between the CITY OF HUGHSON, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of California (hereinafter the "City") and FITZPATRICK HOMES-HUGHSON, LLC, landowners of the Project Site, and hereinafter Called the "Developer". This Amendment #2 is made pursuant to the authority of Section 65864 et seq. of the Government Code of the State of California and amends the terms of the Development Agreement entered into on January 8, 2007 (the "Development Agreement"), and amended October 23, 2017 (the "Amendment #1"). Developer and City are, from time to time, hereinafter referred to individually as a "party" and collectively as the "parties."

I. RECITALS

- A. The City and signatories to the above named Development Agreement and Amendment #1 desire to extend the term of the Development Agreement and amend the *Street* fees found in Part II, Section 3.E.
- B. The City and Developer are entering into this Amendment #2 to memorialize the terms affecting the remainder of the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises, covenants and provisions set forth herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

II. <u>AGREEMENT</u>

- 1. Part II, Section 1.D., is hereby amended to read as follows:
- "D. Term. The term of this Agreement shall commence upon the Effective Date and shall extend until January 16, 20242 or until one (1) year after "Project Buildout" as hereinafter defined, whichever is earlier, unless said term is otherwise modified by circumstances set forth in this Agreement or by the mutual consent of the parties hereto. For purposes of this Agreement, "Project Buildout" shall mean the date on which a Certificate of Occupancy (or comparable instrument) is issued for the last project improvement or residential home or other structure to be constructed in the Project. Following the expiration of said term, this Agreement shall be deemed terminated and of no further force and effect, except as may be specified otherwise herein."

2. Part II, Section 3.E, is hereby amended to read in full as follows:

- 4. This Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if the parties had all signed the same document, and which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 5. Facsimile, electronically scanned, and photocopied signatures shall be as valid as original signatures only for purposes of demonstrating execution of the Amendment until such time as originally executed documents can be circulated. Said originally executed documents shall be binding and shall constitute evidence of the execution of this Amendment for all purposes.
