Frequently Asked Questions

What is the difference between a volunteer and an intern?

- A “volunteer” is an individual who is donating time to the City.
- An “intern” is an individual who is unpaid, generally in school, and is seeking to gain employment skills that will assist them in obtaining a career. An internship will yield in a higher level of work expectation from the individual.

What are the qualifications to become a volunteer/intern with the City of Hughson?

- Must be 16 years of age, and all minors under the age of 18 must have written approval of a parent/guardian to participate in the program.
- Willingness to meet new people and make new friends.
- Flexibility.

What are the hours of operation?

Hours will vary based upon the needs of the department and the availability of the volunteer/intern. City of Hughson Administrative Offices are open M-F from 8am to 5pm.
